New Working Paper Series

The Institute for Regulatory Policy Studies has always worked to maintain an objective, non-biased educational and research program. To achieve this goal, the Institute has begun an ambitious new program of research led by graduate students in the Master's Degree Program. The first working paper is titled "The State of Competition in the Natural Gas Industry," by Josh Clancy. In the introduction, Josh states, "Over the past fifty years the natural gas industry has undergone dramatic changes as it has

attempted to transition from being a non-competitive and highly regulated industry to a more competitive less regulated industry. While quite a bit of research has been done, many questions remain unanswered. Have the changes in regulation been successful? How is the industry changing today? How will the industry change in the future? These are all important questions that need to be answered when analyzing the state of competition in the natural gas industry.

This paper will start by presenting the history of natural gas regulation since the creation of the Natural Gas Act in 1938 (Figure 1). It will then analyze the competitiveness of each natural gas sector using concentration ratios and the Herfindahl-Hirschman Index. These sectors include exploration and extraction, pipeline transportation, distribution, and marketing. Finally, conclusions will be drawn and policy recommendations made."

Illinois Broadband Mapping Project

In June, 2006, the Institute received a grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to develop the first statewide map of broadband services. Working in conjunction with Lieutenant Governor Pat Quinn's Illinois Broadband Deployment Council, the Institute has fielded two surveys to request information. The first survey was sent to local government officials to obtain a comprehensive list of broadband providers in the state. The second survey was sent to broadband providers to request information about the services that they provide and where they provide those services in the State of Illinois.

The objective of this study is to determine the availability of various broadband options at the five digit zip code level throughout the state of Illinois. A detailed map of Illinois displaying the number of providers will be developed with associated demographic and economic information. No detail on which providers serve which area will be released to ensure confidentiality. The purpose of this study is to provide data and analysis to enable policymakers them to develop strategies to enhance broadband availability to un-served or underserved areas.

A completed map and full report should be available by the summer of 2007.
